RICHLAND COUNTY

Formed in 1785, Richland County is home to South Carolina's capital city, Columbia, and has become the entrepreneurial and legislative hub of the state. The county is home to the University of South Carolina's main campus, and Fort Jackson—the Army's largest and most active initial training base. Richland County's diverse economy, institutions of higher education, and entrepreneurial spirit make it an ideal location. Richland County is business ready, with industrial buildings to accommodate businesses with space needs ranging from 3,000 to 280,468 square feet. Additionally, the county is home to 15 industrial sites located throughout its 757 square miles of business friendly soil.

INFRASTRUCTURE

The Central SC Region is home to four major interstates, all easily accessible throughout the region: I-20, I-26, I-77, I-95. These interstates make for smooth travel when commuting to the region's major airport and the state's major port.



Crossing through the county, these interstates provide a total of 39 interchanges, with I-77 providing a direct route to Charlotte, NC.

Columbia Metropolitan Airport (CAE): 10 to 30 minute drive from most locations, it features a UPS air hub and Foreign Trade Zone 127; Jim Hamilton - L.B. Owens Airport (CUB): located within the county.

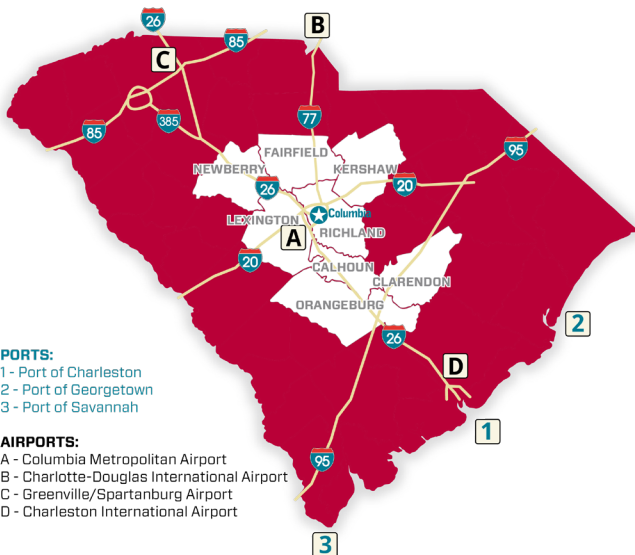

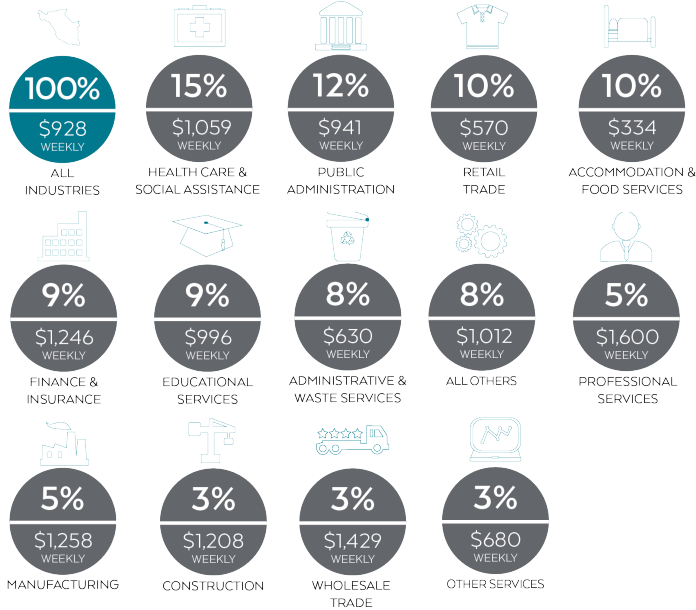

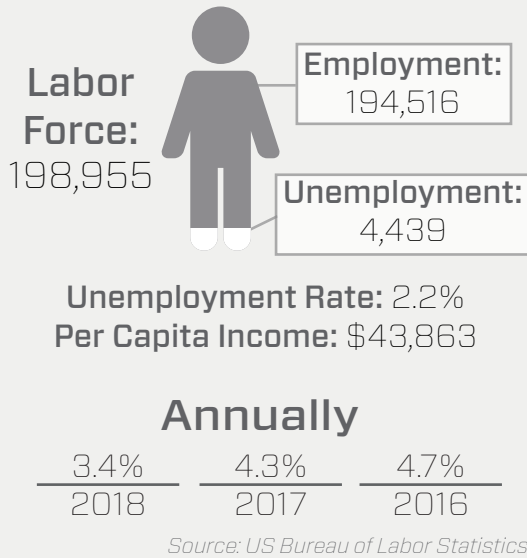

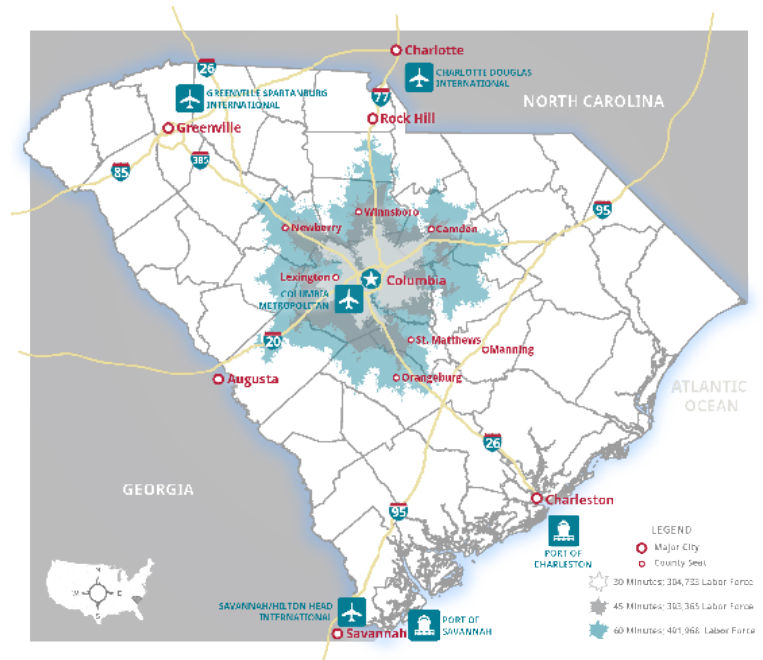

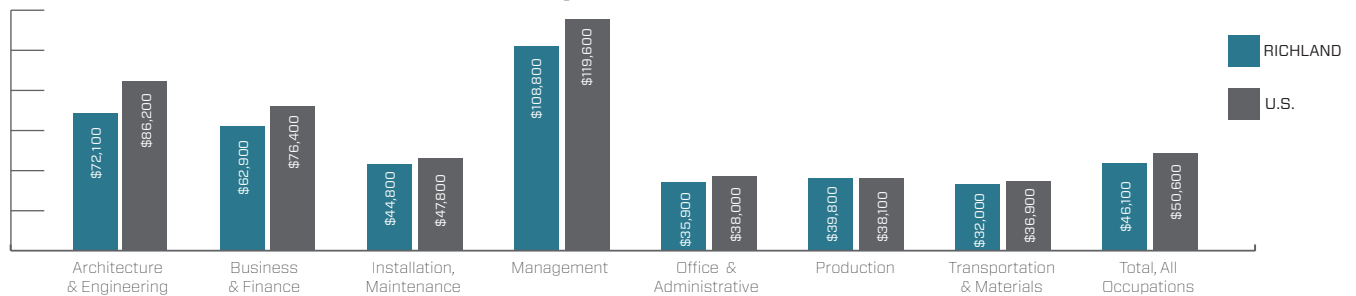
